Welcome to the Hook's Drug Store Museum!

You are stepping into a piece of Indiana's history. The Museum is built to look like a drug store from the 1890s. Here you will learn about the history of pharmacy and see an old-fashioned soda fountain.

Hook's was an Indianapolis-based drug store chain founded in 1900 by John A. Hook, a pharmacist. The first Hook's was located in the Fountain Square area of Indianapolis. By 1950, Hook's had about 50 drug stores throughout Indiana. Hook's existed primarily in Indiana for nearly 100 years. The cabinets in the first room of the Museum were made in 1852 and are from a drug store in Cambridge City, Indiana. The cabinets in the gift shop area are from the first Hook's Drug Store.

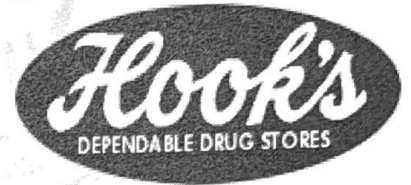

Vintage Pharmacy Bottles

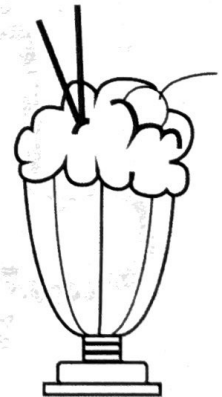


Show Globe

A symbol of pharmacy – there are hanging and standing show globes. Pharmacists would fill them with colored liquid to illustrate their chemical abilities.

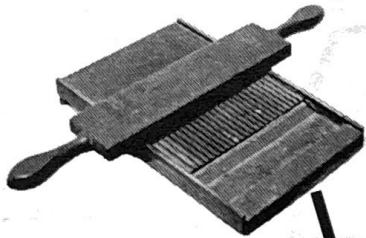
Ice Cream Soda

Ice cream treats are available for sale. Long ago, most drug stores had a soda fountain.



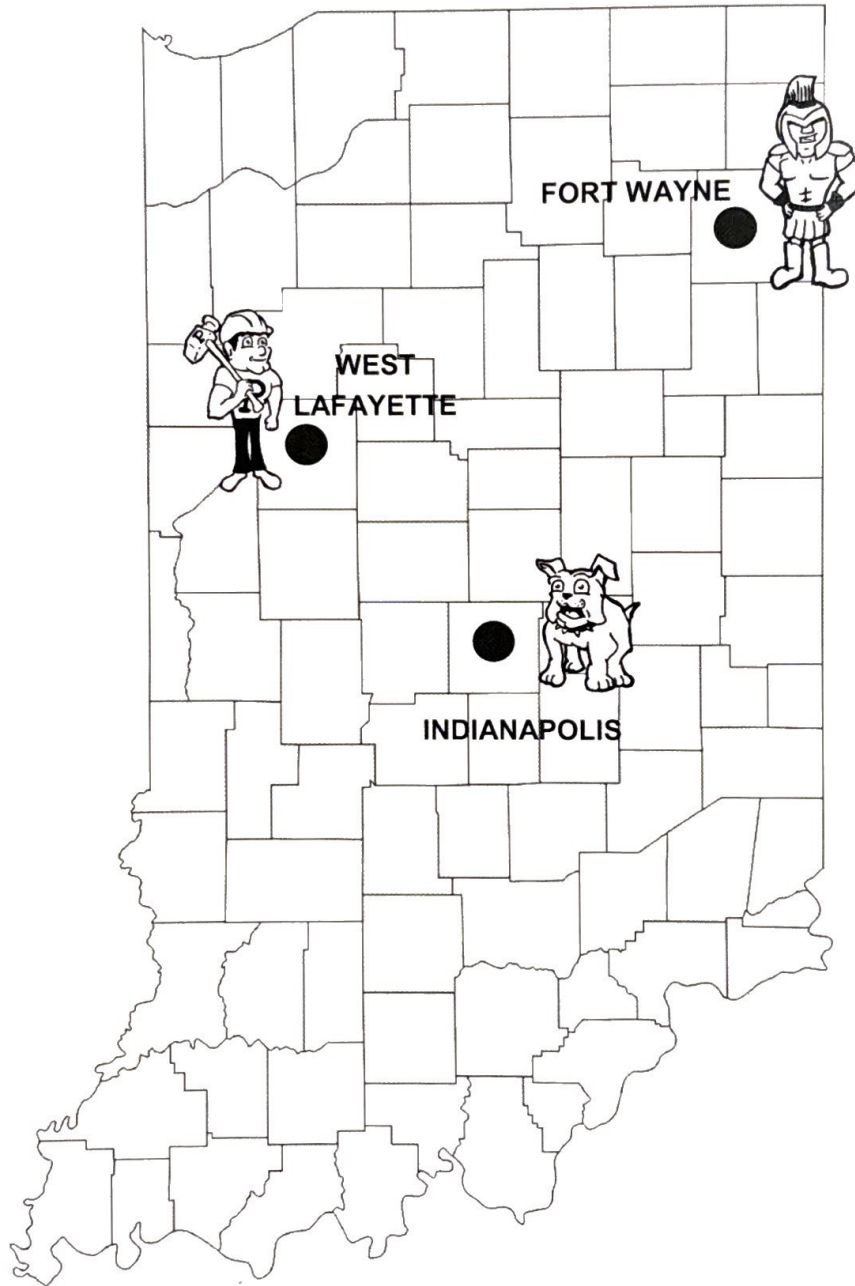
Pill Roller

Indiana Colleges of Pharmacy

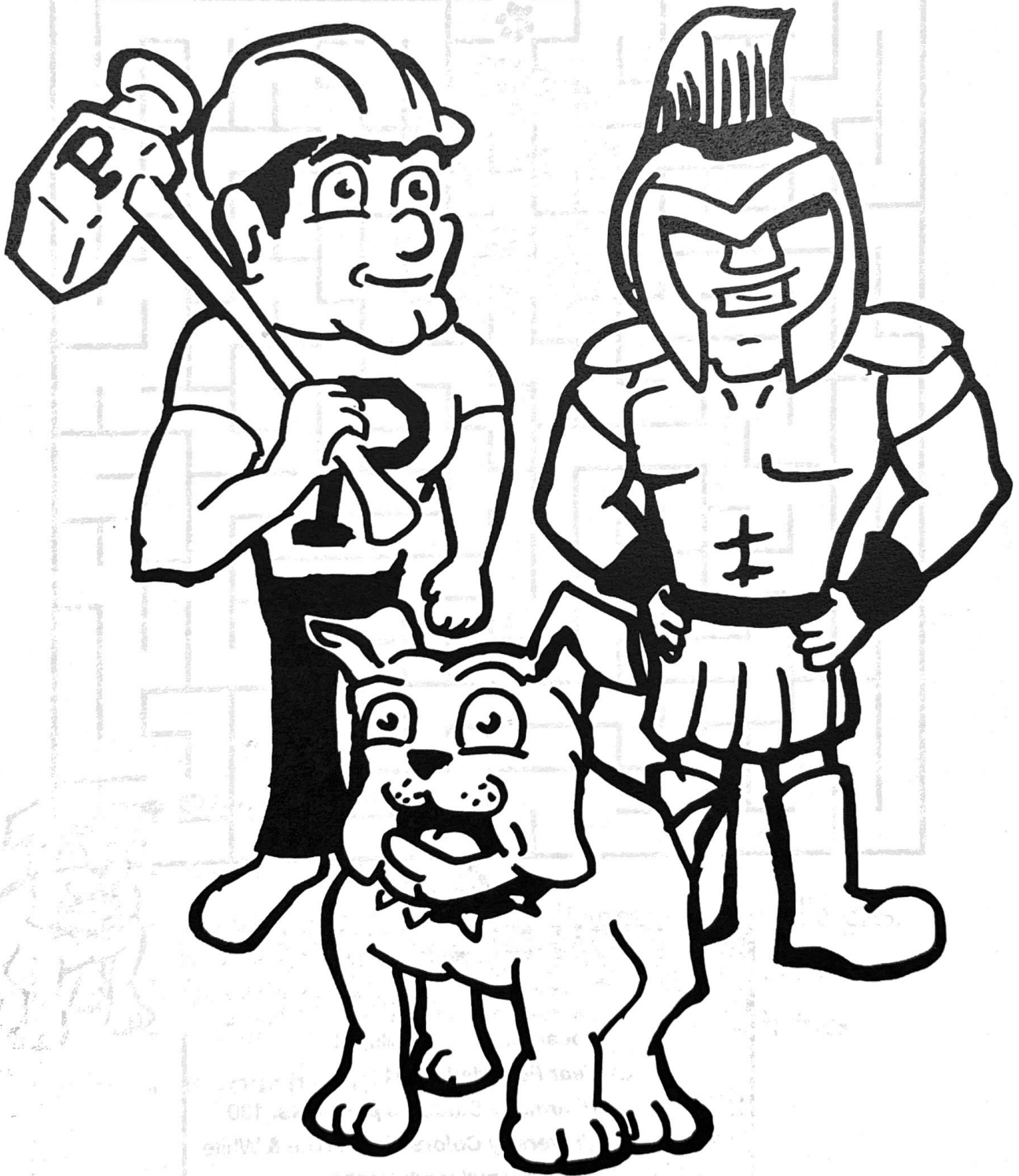

All offer a four-year doctor of pharmacy degree (PharmD). The graduate must then pass a licensure examination to practice as a pharmacist.

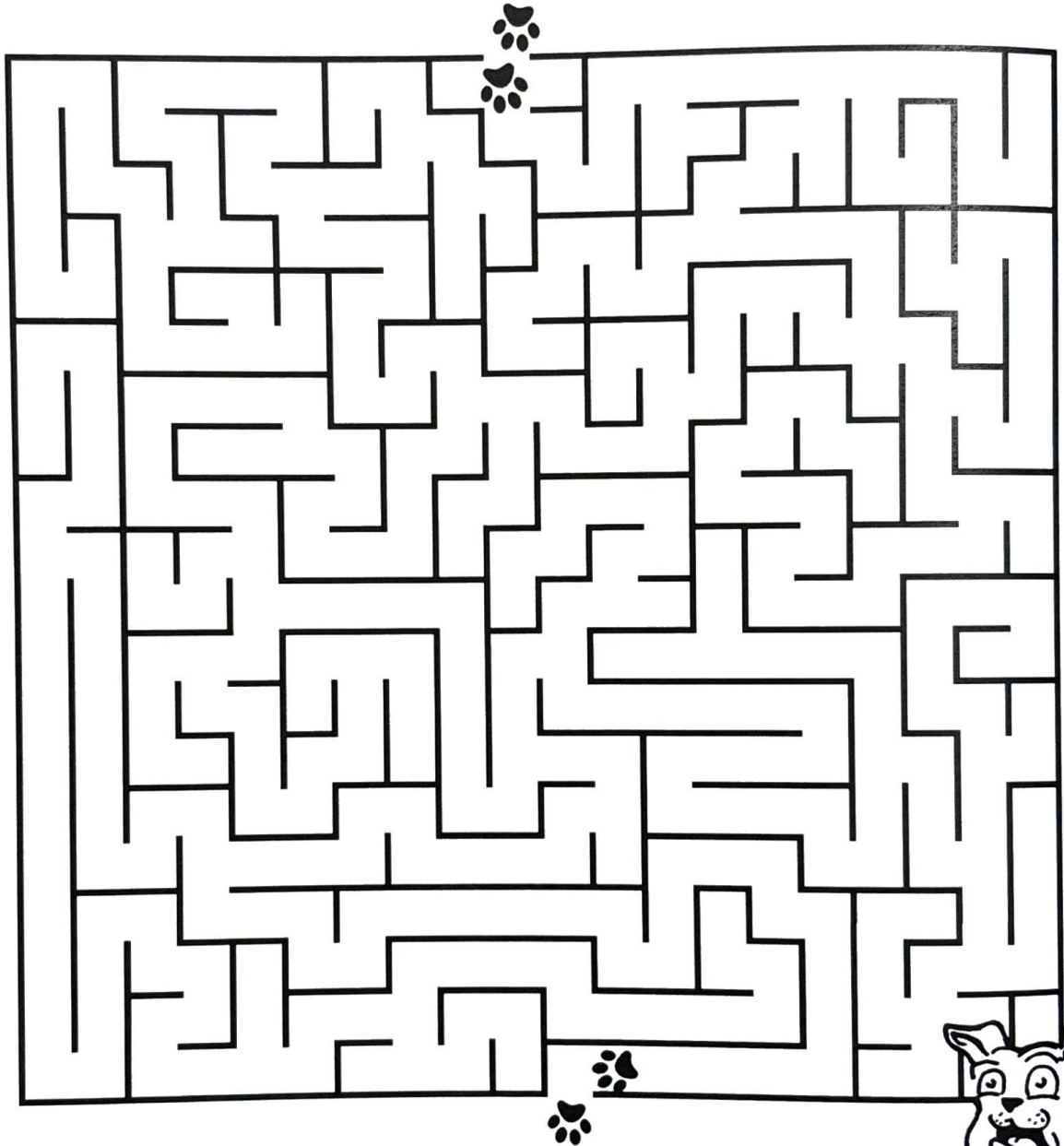
Meet the Mascots

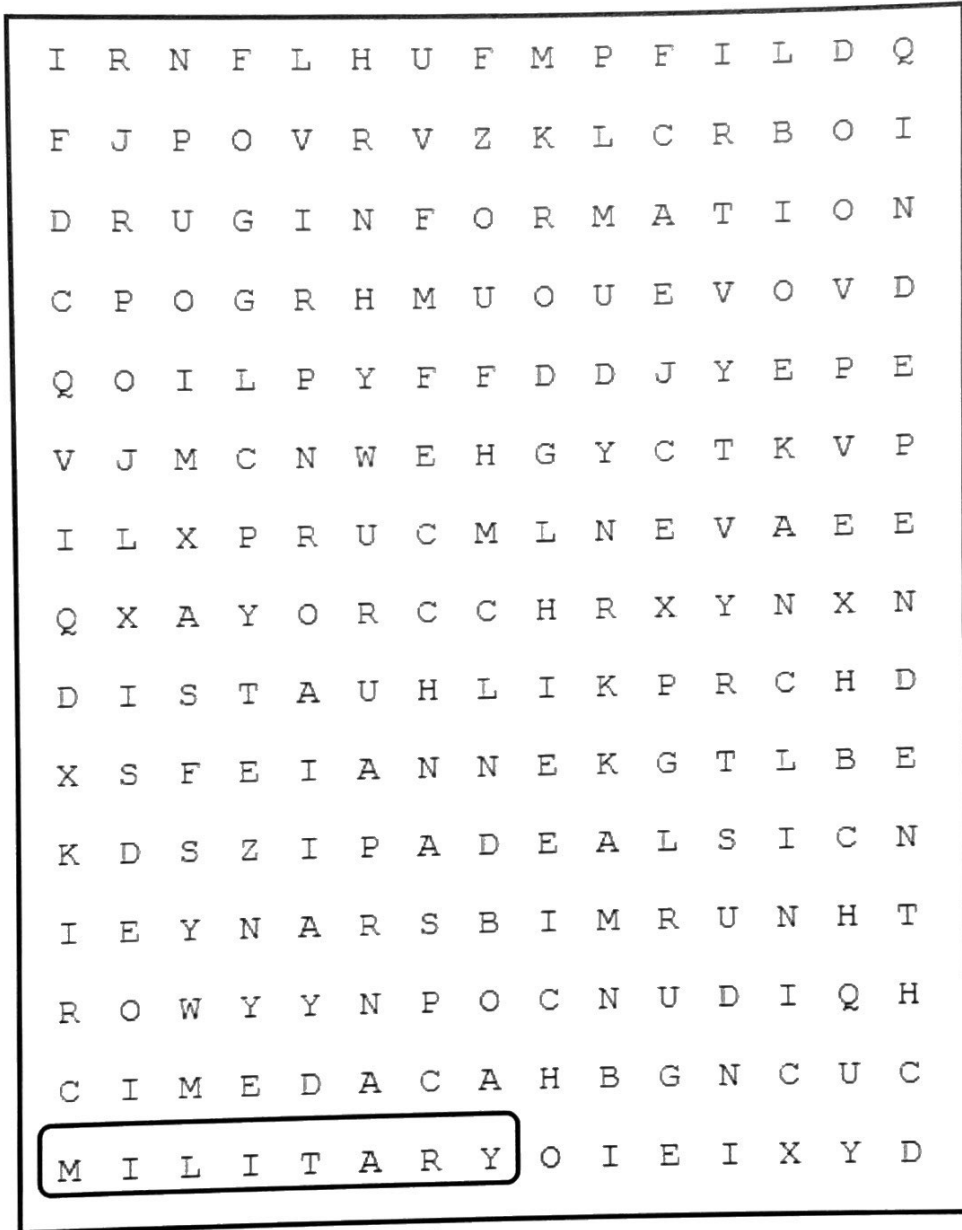
